



Medical and Dental Implications of the Most Prescribed Medications

Are there any medications used in my dental office that could adversely interact with drugs the patient is taking? This discussion includes the indications, contraindications, and side effects of the fifty most commonly prescribed medications. These medications represent 30% of all prescription medications taken by your dental patients. Familiarity with these drugs will provide the dental practitioner with a better appreciation for the health profile of today's dental patient.

Course Objectives:

- 🏠 The medications that could adversely interact with dental drugs
- 🏠 Why your patient is taking their medications
- 🏠 What oral side effects may be caused by these drugs

Dr. Harold L. Crossley is Professor Emeritus at the University of Maryland Dental School. A native of Rhode Island, Dr. Crossley received a Bachelor of Science degree in Pharmacy from the University of Rhode Island in 1964. He later was awarded the Master of Science (1970) and Doctorate degrees (1972) in Pharmacology. The University of Maryland Dental School in Baltimore awarded Dr. Crossley the D.D.S. degree in 1980. The liaison between the classroom and his dental practice which he mentored on a part-time basis in the Dental School Intramural Faculty Practice produced a practical approach to understanding the pharmacology of drugs used in the dental office.

Dr. Crossley has co-authored a number of articles and four books dealing with a variety of topics within the field of pharmacology. Other areas of expertise include the pharmacology of street drugs and chemical dependency. He serves on the Maryland State Dental Association's Well-Being Committee. He is an active member of Phi Kappa Phi, Omicron Kappa Upsilon Honorary Dental Society, the American College of Dentists, and International College of Dentists. He was the recipient of the 2008 Gordon Christensen Lecturer Recognition award presented by the Chicago Dental Society. He has been a consultant for the United States Drug Enforcement Administration and other law enforcement agencies since 1974. Drawing on this unique background, Dr. Crossley has become nationally and internationally recognized as an expert on street drugs and chemical dependency as well as the clinical pharmacology of dental drugs.

Emergency Medicine in Dentistry

Medical emergencies can and do happen in the dental environment. In this seminar he will review preparation for medical emergencies, including the emergency drug kit, basic management of medical emergencies, and recognition and management of: altered consciousness, respiratory distress, drug-related emergencies, and chest pain.

- 🏠 Describe the basic management protocols for sudden cardiac arrest and all other medical emergencies

Dr. Stanley F. Malamed, Dr. Malamed was born and raised in the Bronx, New York, graduating from the New York University College of Dentistry in 1969. He then completed a dental internship and residency in anesthesiology at Montefiore Hospital and Medical Center in the Bronx, New York before serving for 2 years in the U.S. Army Dental Corps at Ft. Knox, Kentucky. In 1973, Dr. Malamed joined the faculty of the Herman Ostrow School of Dentistry of U.S.C., in Los Angeles, where today he is Professor of Anesthesia & Medicine. Dr. Malamed is a Diplomate of the American Dental Board of Anesthesiology, as well as a recipient of the Heidebrink Award [1996] from the American Dental Society of Anesthesiology and the Horace Wells Award from the International Federation of Dental Anesthesia Societies, 1997 (IFDAS).

Dr. Malamed has authored more than 140 scientific papers and 17 chapters in various medical and dental journals and textbooks in the areas of physical evaluation, emergency medicine, local anesthesia, sedation and general anesthesia. In addition, Dr. Malamed is the author of three widely used textbooks, published by CV Mosby: Handbook of Medical Emergencies in the Dental Office (6th edition 2007); Handbook of Local Anesthesia (6th edition 2011); and Sedation - a guide to patient management (5th edition 2010) and two interactive DVD's: Emergency Medicine (2nd edition, 2008) and Malamed's Local Anesthetic Technique DVD (2004)

In his spare time, Dr. Malamed is an avid runner, exercise enthusiast, and admits an addiction to the New York Times crossword puzzle, which he has done daily since his freshman year in dental school

Clinical and Material Factors in Achieving the Ideal Impression

Clinicians report that the impression taking process is the most stressful daily restorative procedure. This presentation will review the key factors involved in capturing perfect impressions predictably and consistently. A discussion on the chemical and physical properties of elastomeric impression and how they relate to their clinical usage will be presented. Tissue management, the most critical aspect of obtaining a perfect impression, will be addressed, including the effectiveness of new and innovative product solutions aimed at procedural simplification. The selection of the appropriate materials as it relates to the ideally suited impression tray will be reviewed. In addition new diagnostic and therapeutic devices will be covered. Participants will learn how to routinely make accurate impressions for fabrication of diagnostic and restorative models and understand the basics of impression materials including how they differ and why they fail.

The Keys to Successful, Predictable, and Efficient Direct Composite Restorations

Direct composite restorations are among the most frequently performed restorative procedures, yet dentists often struggle with placement techniques, options for consistently generating ideal inter-proximal contact and post operative sensitivity. There are several key elements that will determine the success of direct esthetic restorations including tooth preparation, material choice, placement technique and curing method. This presentation will discuss how each element will play a critical role in the professional's decision making process when determining which materials, systems and techniques are best to utilize when doing direct composite restorations. This program will review esthetic principles, modern preparation design and when and where to use "total-etch" and "self-etch" adhesive systems. Additional topics will include proper composite selection and placement techniques, anatomical contouring and finishing and polishing, all of which are essential clinical components to achieving long lasting esthetic restorations.

Dr. Conte earned a BA from the University of Rochester, a DMD from UMDNJ-New Jersey Dental School and an MBA from Wilmington University in DE. He is a board eligible Prosthodontist and holds an appointment as a Clinical Assistant Professor at New Jersey Dental School. In addition, he maintains a part-time clinical practice in Havertown, PA. As a faculty member at NJDS he developed and directed the Esthetic Dentistry Curriculum and managed an undergraduate dental clinic. He enjoys lecturing on dental materials and principles of esthetic dentistry, and is a member of the American Association for Dental Research.
