Oral Pathology Made Easy

Dr. Carpenter will present a clinical outline of oral mucosal lesions. By the use of diagrams, this approach will simplify the understanding of what is occurring at a cellular level. This outline will feature the distinction of lesions into white lesions (leukoplakias, etc.), red lesions (erythroplakias, etc.), vesicubullous lesions (herpes, etc.), ulcer (cankers, etc.), and swellings (mucoceles, etc.). This program will emphasize the diagnosis of the more commonly presenting lesions but also delineate the more dangerous lesions and how to distinguish between the two. Treatment recommendations will also be elaborated, along with details on when lesions should be referred. At the conclusion of the course, the clinician should feel comfortable in assessing and treating most of the commonly encountered abnormalities of the oral cavity.

Goals and Objectives:

- To be able to identify various changes in the oral mucosa
- To be able to establish a differential diagnosis for the various changes that may be encountered
- To become knowledgeable in the various ways that a lesion should be managed or referred for a definitive diagnosis

William M. Carpenter, DDS, has held the position of professor and chair for the Department of Pathology and Medicine at the University of the Pacific School of Dentistry since 1986.

He earned his DDS degree from the University of Pittsburgh, where he was elected to the Omicron Kappa Upsilon dental honor society. Carpenter completed a fellowship and a residency in oral pathology at the U.S. Army Institute of Dental Research and the Armed Forces Institute of Pathology at Walter Reed Army Medical Center in Washington, D.C.

Carpenter has lectured widely throughout the United States and contributed extensively to the dental literature in the fields of oral biology and oral pathology.

The use of dental implants to restore function and esthetics following the loss of teeth has been well documented. As high implant survival and success rates have been reported, the esthetic outcome has become the main focus of interest in esthetically sensitive areas. The prosthetic reconstruction should imitate the appearance of the natural teeth. Clinical cases will illustrate a stepwise approach of tissue manipulation with the use of provisional restorations to create a subgingival contoured sulcus. With the latest technology, a virtual abutment can achieve natural root replacement contours.

The purpose of this presentation is to discuss advancements in machined abutment design: pre-contoured versus CAD/CAM, metal versus ceramic abutments. Decision criteria will be formulated in order to choose between all ceramic abutments and crowns as well as titanium, gold abutments and ceramometal crowns. The clinician will have a better understanding of abutment selection to achieve the ultimate esthetic integration.

- Understand the development of soft tissue profiles with provisional restorations
- Learn immediate provisional restoration techniques for single and multiple prosthesis
- Digital Dentistry - Where are we?

- Management of complications

Integration of Esthetic Dentistry and

Prosthodontics

This presentation will provide a comprehensive look at failure modes and effects in bilayer all-ceramic crown-cement-tooth systems, tying together the influences on resistance to fracture initiation and propagation of ceramic material properties and thickness; crown/tooth geometry; cement modulus and layer thickness; damage induced by shaping, fabrication, clinical adjustments, and sandblasting; and fatigue in the wet intraoral environment.

Dental implants have become an integral part of dental practice today. Maintaining predictability and high success rates impose great challenges to the dental team. Edentulous ridge defects constitute a major problem. In the past long teeth have been placed into defects to take up vertical space. Gingival and tooth symmetry and the esthetic results were often compromised. Long-term predictable results have not always been produced. Prosthetic techniques will be discussed utilizing newly developed ceramic gingival material and design for fixed prosthodontics.

- To understand what factors and concerns a prosthodontist would have treating patients that require "esthetic procedures"
- To understand the controversies that exists with modern dental materials
- To understand what clinical factors impact on long term survival of dental ceramic materials
- To understand the restoration of dental implants in complex conditions

Kenneth A. Malament DDS, MScD, received his DDS from N.Y.U. College of Dentistry and a specialty certificate and Master's degree from Boston University School of Graduate Dentistry. Dr. Malament has a full time practice limited to prosthodontics in Boston that includes a dental laboratory with master dental technologists. He is a Clinical Professor at Tufts University and a Course Director in postgraduate department of Prosthodontics. He is the President of the American Board of Prosthodontics.

How will I know if a person is under the influence of street drugs? What are the warning signs of teenage drug abuse? What can I do if I suspect my child is using drugs? What are the characteristics of and how do I manage the "doctor shopper"? Do I have to take any precautions with the dental patient who is under the influence? Why is it so important that my staff be knowledgeable about street drugs? Why am I at risk? These questions and more will be answered in this dynamic, brutally honest, and graphic presentation that will take you from the streets and into the office to help you identify and manage the substance abusing patient. Discussion includes the origins, types, mechanisms of action, and signs and symptoms of commonly abused prescription and illicit drugs. Learn:

HAROLD L. CROSSLEY, DDS, PhD is a professor emeritus at the University of Maryland Dental School. A native of Rhode Island, Dr. Crossley received a Bachelor of Science degree in Pharmacy from the University of Rhode Island in 1964. He later was awarded the Master of Science (1970) and Doctorate degrees (1972) in Pharmacology. The University of Maryland Dental School in Baltimore awarded Dr. Crossley the DDS degree in 1980. Since that time he has been the Director of Curriculum Innovation and Management, Director of Conjoint Sciences and Preclinical Studies and is currently the Director of Continuing Dental Education at the Dental School. The liaison between the classroom and his dental practice which he mentored on a part-time basis in the Dental School Intramural Faculty Practice produced a practical approach to understanding pharmacology of drugs used in the dental office. Dr. Crossley has co-authored a number of articles and four books dealing with a variety of topics within the field of pharmacology. Other areas of expertise include the pharmacology of street drugs and chemical dependency. He has been appointed to the Governor's Commission on Prescription Drug Abuse, serves on the Maryland State Dental Association's Well-Being Committee. He has been a consultant for the United States Drug Enforcement Administration and other law enforcement agencies since 1974.



This seminar will emphasize the new trends and concepts in periodontal and implant diagnosis and treatment planning. Using a biological basis for disease concepts and enhanced with relevant clinical publications, decisions for both non-surgical and surgical modalities of periodontal therapies will be presented, with extensions to systemic diseases and conditions, including myocardial infarction, cardiovascular accidents (stroke), preterm and low birth weight babies, rheumatoid arthritis, ulcers and others. Advances in periodontal therapies will be included in this course. Ultrasonics, local drug delivery systems, and periodontal and implant surgical concepts have improved prognosis and outcomes. Periodontal and dental implant surgical treatment planning and ridge preservation approaches, post extraction, are included as case presentations.

- 🔧 Understand biological basis for periodontal diseases
- 🔧 Relate oral infections to systemic diseases and conditions
- 🔧 Describe advances in non-surgical periodontal therapies
- 🔧 Understand concepts of periodontal surgeries including regeneration

Jon B. Suzuki, DDS, PhD, MBA, is a current panel member of the Food and Drug Administration and immediate past-chair of the Dental Products Panel, Wheaton, Maryland. He has a presidential appointment as professor of Periodontology and Oral Implantology (School of Dentistry) and professor of Microbiology – Immunology (School of Medicine) at Temple University, Philadelphia. He served as chair of the American Dental Association Council on Scientific Affairs, and served on the National Institutes of Health National Dental Advisory Research Council, Bethesda, Maryland.
